

Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport


A new airport for Western Sydney

The Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport will be a 24/7 curfew-free airport with international, domestic and freight services, capable of handling the full range of aircraft.

The Airport will be developed in stages, growing with demand. The initial stage of development for the Airport will include:

- a 3.7 km runway, capable of receiving the world's largest passenger aircraft (under construction);
- an integrated domestic and international terminal for easier passenger transfers (under construction); and
- initial capacity for 10 million passengers annually, growing to an expected capacity of more than 80 million passengers a year once a second runway is introduced.

During the construction period to late 2026, over 11,000 direct and indirect jobs are expected to be created. Since construction commenced in 2018, over 2,900 jobs have already been supported, with around half of the workforce coming from Western Sydney.
