The Chair advised that this would be the first of three meetings for 2022, with the third meeting expected to be an open meeting.</li> <li>Noted the apologies to the meeting. Refer to Appendix B. 		The Chair confirmed the agenda for the meeting.

2.	Departmental Update	Mr David Jansen (Assistant Secretary, Western Sydney Airport Regulatory Policy) presented an update from the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications.	
		The Department provided an update on airspace design and moving into the environmental assessment phase, for which the Department has appointed WSP Australia. Minister Fletcher announced in December that the preliminary airspace design and draft Environmental Impact Statement will be released for public comment by mid-2023. Feedback from this process informs the detailed design.	Action Item 1: The Department to arrange a
		The Department will continue to update FoWSA on this important work and will look to have WSP present the Engagement Plan at a FoWSA meeting later this year.	presentation on the Engagement Plan for the airspace design EIS.
		The Department is currently following internal processes to enable it to purse the remaining biodiversity offset obligations under the Biodiversity Offset Delivery Plan.

3.	Aerotropolis Multiversity Presentation	Ms Natalie Downing (Director of Operations, NUW Alliance) presented on the Aerotropolis Multiversity's educational and research programs, on behalf of the NUW Alliance.	
		The NUW Alliance is a consortium of four universities; the University of Newcastle, University of New South Wales, University of Wollongong Australia, and Western Sydney University. The multiversity covers all parts

		of New South Wales, and the consortium offers advantages of scale. The NUW Alliance's focus is to help support the Aerotropolis.	
		In 2021, the NUW Alliance set up the Multiversity's initial courses, partly in response to COVID-19. There are nine short courses in STEM available through the Multiversity to upskill workers in Western Sydney with a focus on Undergraduate Certificates.	
		The NUW Alliance has a long-term focus on upskilling the Western Sydney population through their "Engineering Plus" program, which is designed to help upskill people who don't traditionally take up engineering. They will be working with TAFE to address prerequisite knowledge, and the program will be highly integrated with industry.	
		The NUW Alliance and University of Technology Sydney released their Research Vision for the Advanced Manufacturing Research Facility (AMRF) last year. The AMRF will be delivered by the Western Parklands City Authority as part of the Aerotropolis precinct, and will be housed in the first building in the Bradfield City Centre.	
4.	Western Sydney Airport Update	Mr Tim Nairne (Senior External Affairs Adviser, Western Sydney Airport Company) presented an update on construction:	
		<ul> <li>All Tier 1 contract packages have now been awarded, with landside and tech packages being the most recent.</li> <li>The WSA Connectivity Centre officially opened in Penrith on 18 March 2022. The Connectivity Centre is an initiative by Multiplex to connect the local community with job opportunities related to the WSA project.</li> <li>WSA Co launched its Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) on 18 March 2022. WSA Co undertook to provide further details on the RAP at the next FoWSA meeting.</li> </ul>	Action Item 2: WSA Co to provide details on its RAP at the next FoWSA meeting.

		<ul> <li>The majority of the bulk earthworks have been completed and now the focus is shifting to terminal. Runway sealing has also commenced.</li> <li>The technology package is aimed at creating one of the most advanced</li> </ul>	
		airports in the world. Noting the fast pace of technology change, there will be a focus on high level infrastructure today, to support the latest technology closer to the airport opening.	
		Looking forward into 2022, the bulk earthworks will wind down, the basement slab on grade, the M12 West Package awarded, start of terminal steel framing, construction on pavement begins, and Sydney Metro commencing on site.	
		Ms Simone Concha (Executive Manager Sustainability, Western Sydney Airport Company) presented on WSA Co's sustainability commitments.	
		The presentation went through the timeline of WSA's sustainability policy and sustainability plan. Ms Concha also noted:	
		Reducing resource usage is the best starting point for sustainability, and offers the best value for money.	
		Climate change risk assessments are being incorporated into planning for the future.  Propurement is a key aspect of systemability and incorporating.	
		Procurement is a key aspect of sustainability and incorporating sustainability clauses into contracts.	
		<ul> <li>Strategy for sustainability in relation to airport operations is currently being developed.</li> </ul>	
		Ms Concha said there is a focus on energy efficiency, with the support of renewables and offsets to support net zero and carbon neutrality. Additionally, she noted current initiatives such as the use of a hybrid (solar/diesel) generator on site, sourcing of fill material from tunnelling projects elsewhere in Sydney, and passive design principles being incorporated into the terminal design.

		In response to a question from Ms Britt Becroft, Ms Concha confirmed that WSA Co is interested in supporting sustainable aviation fuel initiatives, and will work with airlines on the right solution.	
		Cr Eddie Dogramaci asked what precautions were being taken in relation to impacts on residents and agriculture from aircraft noise and fuel residue. WSA Co noted that the aviation industry is moving towards net zero commitments. Newer aircraft technology has reduced fuel consumption and noise profiles, and progress will continue to be made. Mr Jansen noted that the Department is obliged to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement in relation to the flight paths, which will outline a range of impacts including noise, air pollution, wildlife, and heritage.	
5.	Luddenham Village Discussion Paper	Mr Wayne Willmington (Resident of Luddenham) read a statement on the Luddenham Village Discussion Paper.	
		Mr Willmington stated that 95 per cent of submissions on the discussion paper supported options for new housing development outside the ANEC 20 contours. However, WSA Co made a submission opposing any intensification of residential development in Luddenham. The release of the final Aerotropolis plans has been delayed, and may not include plans for Luddenham.	
		Mr Willmington noted that residents are running a campaign to ensure Luddenham Village survives and thrives, and called on FoWSA for support.	
		The Chair acknowledged Mr Willmington's statement while noting that FoWSA is not a voting or decision-making body. Mr Anthony Pizzolato (NSW DPE) noted that four scenarios were put out in the discussion paper, and feedback would be taken into account as the planning package is settled. Mr Tim Nairne (WSA Co) noted Mr Willmington's concerns and said it was an ongoing conversation.
