1.	Welcome from Chair, confirmation of agenda	 The Chair, Ms Lee de Winton: Opened the meeting by formally acknowledging the Dharug people as the traditional owners of the land on which the Western Sydney Airport is being constructed. Welcomed members to the meeting. The Chair advised that there would be at least one further meeting this calendar year, preferably in person if COVID restrictions allow. Noted the apologies to the meeting and welcomed the alternative representatives. Refer to Appendix B. The apologies included: Senator the Hon Marise Payne – Senator for New South Wales Ms Melissa McIntosh MP, Federal Member for Lindsay Dr Rosemary Dillon, General Manager Blue Mountains City Council Mr David Borger, Director Western Sydney Business Chamber Cr Ross Fowler OAM – Penrith City Council Mr Paul Rasmussen, Hawkesbury City Council Confirmed the agenda for the meeting. The Chair referred to previous action items. There were three Action Items arising from Meeting 13 and six outstanding action items from previous meetings.

		FOWSA Meeting 13, Item 1 - Department to provide an update on its approach to community engagement at the next FoWSA meeting.	
		This was addressed in the Departmental Update at Agenda Item 2, and this item will be closed.	
		FOWSA Meeting 13, Item 2 - Department will arrange a FoWSA presentation on the flight path design process this calendar year.	
		This was addressed in the Flight Path Update at Agenda Item 3, with further briefings to be provided at future FoWSA meetings. The item is ongoing.	
		FOWSA Meeting 13, Item 3 – Department will prepare a fact sheet on the progress of flight path design that can be disseminated in the community.	
		The fact sheet was circulated to FoWSA members following Meeting 13, and is published on the Department's website at	
		https://www.westernsydneyairport.gov.au/media- resources/resources/factsheets. This item will be closed.	
2.	Departmental Update	Mr David Jansen (Assistant Secretary, Western Sydney Airport Regulatory Policy) presented an update from the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications.	
		The presentation included an update on the Department's community engagement strategy, upcoming variation to the Airport Plan relating to rail construction, ongoing government support for the aviation industry, and an update on flight path design.	

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		The Department advised that it is currently developing a Community Engagement and Communications Strategy in relation to the airspace design process. The strategy will consider lessons learned from similar processes, identify the best communications channels to reach affected communities	
		A draft strategy is expected to be ready by the end of August, and the Department will share further information at the next FoWSA meeting.	
		The Department noted that a number of Government programs to support the aviation industry were recently extended.	
		The Department also noted that an amendment to the Airport Plan would be forthcoming to take account of the recently approved Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport line.	
3.	Flight path update	The Department presented an update on the flight path design process. The Department noted that the preliminary design is being developed in line with Condition 16 of the Airport Plan. Key principles include avoiding residential overflight as far as possible, considering impacts on the Greater Blue Mountains World Heritage Area, and avoiding changes to Sydney (Kingsford Smith) Airport. Airspace in the Sydney Basin is complex. The runway alignment was chosen based on meteorological suitability, and to reduce conflicts with existing airports in the basin.	
		In response to a query from Ms Anne Stanley MP, the Department advised that sufficient time has been allowed for detailed design work to take place after the EIS public consultation, and take community input into account.	

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		The Department outlined the social impact analysis process, which is a key input to the design. Mapping of noise sensitive sites such as residences, schools, health and aged care facilities, including expected future developments, is regularly updated and taken into account. Night time flight paths will be designed to further minimise residential overflight.	
		Ms Bromilow commented that it would be vital to educate Blue Mountains residents.	
		Dr Mike Freelander MP asked whether development in Macarthur had been considered, including proposed university and school developments. The Department advised that every LGA in Sydney has been considered, and the Department is working with the NSW Government to get as much information as possible on future planning proposals.	
		Mr Idiculas asked whether flight paths would be affected by bushfires. The Department advised that smoke would slow down operations, although this is also the case for fog, which is a more frequent issue. Firefighting and other emergency aircraft always have priority access to airspace.	
		In response to a query from Ms Bromilow, the Department advised that RAAF Base Glenbrook would not be affected by the WSA flight paths, as there is no restricted airspace at Glenbrook.	
4.	Western Sydney Airport Update	The Chair invited Mr Scott MacKillop, Chief Corporate Affairs Officer and Ms Katy Hannouch, General Manager, Community Engagement and Partnerships from WSA Co, to provide an update on recent progress.	Action item 1: WSA Co to invite FOWSA members to a webinar on the terminal design.

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		Ms Hannouch advised that major earthworks are continuing and the	
		Terminal design is at 97%. Workforce targets for local employments, skill	
		training of workers and diversity are being met.	
		Ms Hannouch shared an animated flythrough of the terminal design.	
		The WSA Experience Centre has been temporarily closed due to COVID	
		restrictions, but 16,000 people have visited since opening in September 2019.	
		Terminal construction will commence towards the end of 2021. Contracts	
		are expected to be awarded for runway and taxiway construction, and a	
		technology package in the next 3-6 months. A webinar and community	
		newsletter are scheduled for September/October.	
5.	Sydney Metro Update	Ms Angela Jeffrey from Sydney Metro, provided an update on the Sydney	
		Metro – Western Sydney Airport project.	
		Sydney Metro –Western Sydney Airport was granted planning approval in	
		July 2021, following exhibition of the Environmental Impact Statement in late	
		2020.	
		The project will deliver six stations across the alignment – St Marys	
		(interchange with T1 Line), Orchard Hills, Luddenham, Airport Business	
		Park, Airport Terminal and Aerotropolis/Bradfield.	
		Main construction is due to start later in 2021. Tunnelling contracts are	
		expected to be awarded in December 2021, and tunnel boring machines will	
		commence on site in 2023.	

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		FOWSA members noted concern about a lack of public transport connectivity to the airport from other parts of Western Sydney, including Camden and Macarthur.	
6.	Other Business	 The Chair sought feedback on the process for publishing FOWSA meeting outcomes through a Record of Meeting. No objections were raised on the current process. The next meeting will be arranged by the FoWSA Secretariat before the end of 2021. FoWSA members are welcome to contact the FoWSA secretariat with any queries or concerns. 	
		In response to a member query on construction taking place during lockdown, Mr Mackillop confirmed that construction had halted when required, but has resumed in line with NSW Health orders. The nature of work being undertaken is compatible with social distancing requirements.	
		The meeting was closed by the Chair at 11:55 am.
